

2025 Mini-Grant Funding Opportunity for Projects within the Peconic Estuary and Watershed

The Peconic Estuary Partnership (PEP) is pleased to announce the 2025 Mini-Grant Funding Opportunity for projects in the Peconic Estuary and Watershed. PEP invites organizations to apply for a 2025 PEP Mini Grant to implement a project that assists in accomplishing PEP's 2020 Comprehensive Conservation Management Plan (CCMP) goal of Clean Waters for Ecosystem Health and Safe Recreation. For more specific information on PEP goals and watershed delineation, please see the PEP's 2020 CCMP; Actions 16-22, and community outreach projects that apply to these actions. Additionally, we will be including Action 8 from the Strong Partnerships and Engagement section.

Key Information

- → Proposals will be considered up to \$50,000.
- → Funds can be applied toward project implementation; outreach and public education; and/or facilitation and planning of water quality endeavors.
- → Money will be dispersed via project reimbursement. The mini grant can be used as funding for a standalone project or contribute to a larger existing project.
- → Applicants must be an organization capable of receiving funds.
- → If your project is chosen, grantees will have to set up a Subaward Contract with Stony Brook University. (Not required at time of application. More information below.)

Important Dates

- → PEP will hold a Q&A Zoom on October 8th. Please bring any questions to this meeting.
- → Deadline for mini grant applications is November 15, 2025
- → Winners will be announced December 2025
- → Contract creation information must be sent to Stony Brook University by January 30, 2026.
- → (If Applicable) QAPP must be submitted to EPA by February 1, 2026.
- → Projects must be completed within one year of Stony Brook Subaward Contract execution. Extensions are possible and will be reviewed on a case by case basis.

- 4) Relevance of the proposed project to any of Actions 16-22 under PEP CCMP Goal: Clean Waters for Ecosystem Health and Safe Recreation, or Action 8 from the Strong Partnerships and Engagement Goal.

*For Final Grant Awardees only- the subaward contract with Stony Brook University will require:

- Applicants must be an organization capable of receiving funds
- Detailed Task-based Budget
- Summary Budget Table
- Project Timeline
- Quality Assurance Project Plan (QAPP), to be reviewed by the EPA, if the project will include data collection
- Reporting: Quarterly Reporting
- Quarterly invoicing for reimbursement
- Final presentation to PEP Committees
